bookkeeper for the Central Union elephone Company, was arrested today for forgery. and was committed to
the Criminal Court under $\$ 25.000$ the Criminal Court under $\$ 25.000$
bonds. Three years ago Whitman
entered the telephone company's employ, and rapidly won his way to a
position of confidence and responsibility. Within those three years, so
far as ascertained, he has stolen $\$ 20$, , 000. On June 16 last he forged two
checks for $\$ 20.000$ each on the North. western National Bank. He drew up
a check on the bank to the order of $F$. P. Ross, Manager of the telephone
company, signed by W. S. Chapman, the Treasurer, and countersigned by
Geo. I. Phillips, the President, and indorsed by Ross. On the same day. and in like fashion, as well as to an
equal amount, Whitman fraudulently issued ano.her check. except that in
this instance C. H. Wilson was the payee.
