EARTHQUAKES.

CHICAGO, August 2.—Dispatches from Jacksonville, Centralia and Jonesboro, Ill., this morning indicate that the early earthquake shocks noted at Nashville, Tenn., St. Louis and Evansville, Ind., were general throughout southern and central Illinois.

EVANSVILLE, Ind., August 2.—At 12:30 this a. m. a slight earthquake shock was felt here, three tremors following each other.

ST. LOUIS, Aug. 2.—A slight earthquake shock was felt here at 12:36 this morning. It woke up the occupants of houses but no damage is reported.

HUNTSVILLE, Ala., Aug. 2.—At 12:30 this morning a distinct earthquake shock was felt in this city, arousing sleepers by the noise and motion.
