Frightful Fall of Finland Miners.

MARQUETTE, Mich., Aug. 13.—The third fatal mine accident in the upper peninsula by the overturning of a skip occurred at the Cleveland mine, Ishpeming, this morning. Seven Finland miners boarded the skip to descend the shaft. The skip turned over throwing all to the bottom. Three were killed outright, three sustained probably fatal injuries and two escaped. The victims names are not given. Most of them leave families in poor circumstances.
