

His father told him to go and kill Jones. Young Sheppard returned to Scary on Tuesday, and, walking up behind Jones, struck him on the back of the head with a club, killing him instantly. He was arrested, and strong talk of lynching him is indulged in by the citizens. Berry Sheppard, the father, is a rough man and has served a term in the penitentiary.
