Call for a Prohibition State Convention

The State Convention of the Prohibitionists of North Carolina, will be held in Greensboro, on Wednesday, May 19, 1888 at ten a. m.

The business of the Convention will be

- 1. The selection of twenty-six delegates, and as many alternates, to attend the National Convention to be held at Indianapolis, June 6, 1888.
2. The selection of eleven Candidates as Presidential Electors.
3. The nomination of Candidates for State officers.
4. The election of a State executive committee.
5. The full and complete organization of the State.

To the Convention are cordially invited.

1. The "veteran 448" who voted for St. John in 1884;

2. The ten times larger number who cast ballots for Prohibition candidates in 1886; and

3. The hundred times larger number who are convinced,

That the legal suppression of the traffic in alcoholic drinks is the most vital political issue of the day;

That it can be suppressed only by the continuous action of a party intent on bringing all department of government to bear upon the saloon system; and

That neither the Democratic nor the Republican party, founded upon issues which are settled, each now containing a liquor vote larger than its last majority and daily offering greater bids for the whole of it, can ever take up the issue and give the people an enforced Prohibition, State and National.


