Secretary of State J. Bryan Grimes has inaugurated an innovation in connection with the printing of the laws which will prove a great convenience and saving for the people generally who have occasion to want copies of these laws. He has the State printers as they make up the forms for the printing of the acts in book forms to strike off say 50 copies of each law in regular book page form. These are placed on file so that they can be mailed to any interested citizen who may have occasion to request a copy for any purpose. Heretotore the only way to get a copy of most of the general and special acts was to copy it from the original, this system entailing much work on the clerical force of the State Department as well as needless expense upon the party asking for the copy. -Raleigh Post.
