Prof. Thorne, Principal of the school is a hard worker and progressive educator. He has built up a good school, with brighter prospects for the future.

## Craven Crops

The outlook for the tobacco crop in this section is very promising, while other crops have suffered from cold and excessive rains. The tobacco plants have escaped. In size the crop is fully up to the average at this season. No complaint has been heard of worms—in fact the crop is almost a perfect one in size and condition.

The acreage is largely increased. Around Newport the increase is fully 100 per cent; in the Vanceboro and other sections from 25 to 50 per cent. The quantity of tobacco handled by this market the coming season promises to be far in excess of any previous year. —New Bern Journal.
