Resolutions.

The people of the town of Greenville and of the County of Pitt County massed together assembled on the last day of September when the 1st anniversary of the assassination of President William McKinley was observed.

1st. That we desire to express our deep sorrow and indignation at the assassination of the President of the United States.

2nd. That we regret the fact that it was a shot which deprived him of life who was also directed at the existence of our Nation and was a wicked and murderous attack on those rights and liberties which are the inestimable privileges of every citizen of this great Union of States.

3rd. That justice to ourselves and to the people of our country as well as the safety and preservation of good government and all that a free people hold most dear demand the enactment and rigid enforcement of stringent laws whereby anarchism and its vile teachings shall be forever stamped out and crushed within our borders, and that no person who teaches, proclaims or defends such infamous doctrines shall be permitted to come to this country, and every known anarchist now residing here shall be expelled from our borders as an enemy to good government and to our liberty loving people.

4th. That we honor and revere the memory of our martyred President William McKinley, as a beloved citizen and wise ruler, whose public life embodied and illustrated the highest order of statesmanship, unquestioned integrity and exalted patriotism, and whose private and domestic life embodied the noblest and purest qualities which constitute and proclaim the gentleman, the patriot and the sincere Christian.

5th. That our profoundest sympathies are with, and through life will be, with the grief stricken widow in the deep affliction which has betallen her and thrown to the gloom which surrounds her, and in the sorrow which envelopes all of us, n glimmer of light may now be seen, let us trust as we believed in the shadow of death. READ THIS

Mr. Wm. M. May, 1901.

Having decided to move my residence to the town of Greenville, I am sending to the County Commissioners a petition to the Legislature to provide a suitable place of residence for the State Auditor, a weigher who shall weigh any bag of cotton or other material sent to the town of Greenville. Shall be guilty of a misdemeanor if he does not weigh the cotton or other material sent to the town of Greenville. No valid objection can be taken to this bill as it is in the interest of the State to have a weigher appointed and constitute the platform at the wharf at the Old D. Connor Steam Ship Company. The petition was filed in the name of General J. L. Wooten offered which is in the opinion of the weigher more convenient.

The law provides that the weigher shall receive \$1000 per annum for his services, \$1000 per annum for his expenses, \$1000 per annum for his board, and \$1000 per annum for his keep. By law the weigher may also collect \$1000 per annum from the cotton dealers. The bill also provides that the weigher may collect \$4800 per annum from cotton dealers for weighing.

I hope you will pass this bill. I have heard of no other bill which possesses so many good qualities as this does in every respect.
