Whereas, official information has been received at this department that a gin house and cotton of John Grimes were burned on the 21st of October, 1902, by a party unknown, and whereas, it appears that the said party unknown has fled the State, or so conceals himself that the ordinary process of law cannot be served upon him and, therefore, I, Charles B. Aycock, Governor of the State of North Carolina, by virtue of authority vested by law, do issue this Proclamation, offering a reward of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars for the apprehension and delivery of the said party unknown to the Sheriff of Pitt county at the Court-house in Greenville, with evidence sufficient to convict and I do enjoin all officers of the State and all good citizens to assist in bringing said criminal to justice. Done at our City of Raleigh, the 30th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and two, and in the one hundred and twenty-seventh year of our American Independence.
