Here the president refers to the proposal of the czar for a reduction of the vast military establishments, and his readiness to participate in the conference. We desire, in common with the most civilized nations, to reduce to the lowest possible point, the damage sustained in time of war.

He suggests that congress authorize the executive to correspond with the principal martime powers with a view to incorporating into the law of civilized nations the exemption of all private property at sea, except contraband of war, from capture or destruction by belligerents.

Then follows estimates of government receipts for the fiscal year ending June 30; also expenditures, amount of money in the treasury, etc. [On account of the lateness of the hour we omit much of the message at this point.]

After discussing many things vary ing in interest the president recommends that he be authorized to enlist a hundred thousand men in the regular army. 'Several department reports will be laid before you and they will give in detail the conduct of officers of the government during the past year and discuss many questions upon which congress may feel called upon
