IRON WORKERS WILL RETURN TO WORK

Temporary Wage Scale Signed By Men On Strike on Pacific Coast.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal.—A temporary wage schedule which will permit 20,000 iron workers, who struck here last Monday to return to work immediately upon ratification of the agreement by the unions concerned, pending final adjudication of their differences by the Federal Board of Conciliation, was signed today at a conference between representatives of the men, their employes and federal mediators.

Gavin McNab, a San Francisco attorney, appointed Friday by President Wilson as a special representative of the Federal Shipping Board to adjust the trouble here, said that a telegram received today from the President appealing to "The patriotic co-operation of the workmen and their leaders," was instrumental in effecting the settlement. Employees said they thought it would be possible to resume work Thursday. The walk-out has tied up government shipbuilding contracts, estimate dat \$150,000,000.
