By virtue of a decree of the Superior Court of Pitt County, made in the above entitled Special Proceedings, numbered 2194, the undersigned commissioners, will on Saturday the 16th day of November, 1918, at eleven o'clock, in the morning, on the premises offered for sale, sell the following distributed tract of land: known as lots numbered one, two, three, six and nine in the division of land of the late John Moore, a copy of which division can be seen in the office of the register of deeds of Pitt County, in Book 17, at Page 697:

Lot No. One is described as follows: Beginning at a lightwood stake in the pine woods, and runs North 70 West 50 1/2 poles to a pine stump on a tar-kiln-bed; thence North 4 West 89 1/2 poles to a maple; thence North 22 1/2 East to the main road, a stake thence with said road nearly East to a post oak thence North 22 East to a small branch, John Junior Cherry's line, thence with Cherry's line to the beginning. Containing 72 acres, more or less.

Beginning at a maple the third corner of lot No. 1 in said division, at the corner of a fence and runs west 33 1/2 poles to a stake; thence North to the main road, to a stake, thence North 29 East to the branch, Cherry's line; thence with the branch to the corner of lot No. 1, thence with the line of lot No. 1 to the beginning.
