**DEFENDS U. S. FROM
DEPUTY'S CHARGES**

Rio Janeiro (By cable to New York)—The newspaper Razao took issue with the elements that are fostering anti-American agitation in Brazil. Referring to the speech of Deputy Mauricio Lacerda in the chamber the Razao said:

"We do not approve of Lacerda's support of agitation against the United States, who, using his journalistic prerogatives, launched accusations against that nation which has always been a friend of Brazil.
"Albuquerque is a private citizen and is unable to create difficulties. However, the deputy's opposition to France's transfer of her Brazilian loans to the United States changes the aspect of

the case. It is absurd to deny the right of England and France to transfer their loans. The war has changed financial dominion from London to New York. Transfer of the loans is to our advantage because it is against the interests of the United States to lower the value of Brazilian money, since we would be obliged to overpay for our products and they would have to overpay for ours. Knowing the critical financial conditions in Europe, transfer of the Brazilian loans to the United States is wise and reflects credit on Brazil's financial standing.
The Razao ridiculed the charges of American imperialism, declaring that Brazil "is not threatened with conquest".
Among other things, Lacerda declared in his speech that sincerity of the Monroe doctrine must commence with cancellation of international expansion and restoration of California and Texas to Mexico.
"If the Monroe doctrine defends America from Europe who will defend America from America?" he asked. "American capital is aggressive and the dollar has always been guarded by cannons. This is proven in Mexico, where dollar expansion has undermined the government, systematically destroying autonomy. Transfer of our debts to the United States would place Brazil under the threat of aggressive protection."

ARE NOT REALLY LOCUSTS
Unwelcome Visitors Expected This Year Periodical Cicadas, According to Wisconsin Entomologist.
Be scientific—call the "17-year locust" by its right name, the periodical cicada, and no one will worry about it, says H. F. Wilson, entomologist at the Wisconsin experiment station. Cicadas are common insects, but locusts are reminders of the scourge of locusts in biblical days, and the grasshoppers, or true locusts, of the early days in the southwest.
Even the orchard-man's fear of the effect of this particular cicada is not very well founded, judging from the information entomologists have about the insect, for other members of the tribe appear each year and injure the shade and orchard trees in exactly the same way.
The injury is the result of the cicada's laying eggs in the twigs of trees. From the eggs the larvae of the insect hatch. The twig enlarges at that point, growth is interrupted and sooner or later the twig rots and breaks off. The only treatment is to prune off the parts affected. No preventive methods are considered necessary by either horticulturists or entomologists at the station.
Charts of the different broods of the so-called locusts have been prepared by entomologists of the United States department of agriculture, says Mr. Wilson, and they show that the brood expected this year is No. 10. Seventeen years ago it was reported in Wisconsin only in Dane county. The last brood appeared in 1915 and was quite generally scattered over the state.
