Notice is hereby given by the Board of County Commissioners of Pitt county, in regular session assembled, on Monday, October 6, 1919, ordered that election be held, in the following described territory or district, in Bethel township.

"Beginning at M. O. Blount's home farm and running with his back line to Theophilus Carson's land; thence with Carson's back line to Charlie Reddick's line to Julia Ward's farm; thence with her line to Sam Whitehurst's farm; thence with Sam Whitehurst's line to T. A. Carson's farm; thence with Carson's line to R. R. Whitehurst's farm; thence with R. R. Whitehurst's line to Billy Manning's farm; thence with Manning's line to Jasper Manning's farm; thence with Jasper Manning's line to Fernanda Whitehurst's home farm; thence with his line to J. H. Whitehurst farm; thence with J. H. Whitehurst's line to J. R. Whitehurst's farm; thence with J. R. Said election to be held on Wednesday, December 31, 1919, at Whitehurst's school house, then the above described territory or district as to whether there shall or shall not be levied and collected a special School Tax of 30 cents on the One Hundred Dollar valuation of property, and 90 cents on the poll, in the above described territory or district, and at said election those favoring said special tax shall vote a written or printed ballot containing the words "FOR SPECIAL SCHOOL TAX"; those opposed shall vote a written or printed ballot containing the words "AGAINST SPECIAL SCHOOL TAX".

It is further ordered that S. C. Whitehurst be and is hereby appointed registrar for said election and W. C. Reddick and T. A. Carson be and they are hereby appointed poll holders or judges of the election.

It is further ordered that a new registration is and shall be required, the registration books of said territory or district shall be opened on Saturday, November 29, 1919, and closed Tuesday, December 20, 1919, for the purpose of registering the qualified voters of said district or territory.
