JUSTICE SIGNS FORMAL ORDER OF INJUNCTION

(By Associated Press.)

Washington.—Justice Bailey of the District of Columbia Supreme Court today signed the formal order of in-junction against the United States Shipping Board to prevent the sale of the twenty nine former German liners. The court consented to the request of the board that the steamship Sewanee which was sold for two million dollars be excluded from the injunc-tion order.

William Randolph Hearst who brought the proceedings, furnished ten thousand dollars bond to indemnify the shipping board against any loss.
