Adjudication of Final Report

This cause coming on to be heard on the 23rd day of March 1920, and thereof continued to this day, in accordance with the order therefor heretofore made, and it appearing to the court that the notices of this hearing have been duly given as directed in said order, to wit: At the Court House Door in Greenville and five other public places in Pitt County Drainage District No. 2, and by publishing the same in the Greenville Daily News, a newspaper of general circulation, in Pitt County, for more than twenty days preceding March 23rd, 1920.

And the final report of the Board of Viewers, together with a map of the said Drainage District and the profile of the proposed canal having been on file in this office of the Clerk of the Superior Court of Pitt County, all of which have been open to the inspection of all land owners and others interested in the lands within the said district for more than twenty days next preceding March 23rd, 1920.

And all objections which have been filed in writing to said report having been duly considered together with the final report of the Board of Viewers,

The Court finds as a fact that the costs of construction of the proposed Drainage Canal is less than will be the benefits which will accrue to the lands within the said District and affected by the said Drainage Canal, that the benefits which will accrue to the said lands from the construction of the said canal will be much greater than the cost thereof.

The Court further finds that more than 3/5 three fifths of the land within the said District and which will be affected by the construction of the proposed canal is still owned by Petitioners in this proceeding; and that no petitioner has with drawn from the Petition filed in this proceeding.

The Court further finds, as a fact, that no claim for damages on account of the establishment of the proposed canal has been filed.

The Court further finds that a Final Report of the Board of Viewers filed in this proceeding and now under consideration renders substantial and equal justice to all land owners within the District.

It is, therefore, ordered, adjudged and decreed that the Final Report of the Board of Viewers filed in this proceeding together with the map and profile, be, and the same is hereby on all respects confirmed, and stands as a part of the record and judgment of the Court in this Proceeding.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that the territory indicated and described in the said Final Report and set forth in the plat made thereof, and filed therewith, be, and the same

is established as Grindle Creek Drainage District No. 2 under the provision 442 of the public laws of 1900 and amendments thereto, after full consideration of the said Final Report and objections filed thereto.

It is further ordered that an election be held in the Court House in Greenville, Pitt County, said State on the 15th day of April 1920, to vote for Drainage Commissioners for Pitt County Drainage District No. 2. Each individual land owner within the said District will be qualified to vote in such election. The Court appoints..... and ..... three disinterested free holders judges of this election. The Court will appoint three Drainage Commissioners from among those receiving a majority of votes in the said election, or if any or more of such proposed Drainage Commissioners shall not receive the vote of a majority of such land owners, the Court will appoint all, or the remainder for those voted for in said election.

It is further ordered that a copy of this be posted at the Court House door in Greenville and at five conspicuous places within the said Drainage District, and shall be published for consecutive weeks in the Greenville Daily News, a newspaper of general circulation throughout the County.
