ROBINS OUTPLAYED BY THE NEW BERN BEARS

New Bern, Aug. 12.—The Robins dropped another game to the Bears today, but it was a different sort of game as that played here Wednesday. The contest was a pitcher's battle between Larisey for Kinston and Lady Wilson for the locals, with the odds lightly in favor of the latter. But Larisey threw a scare into the fans when for five innings, he held the Bears hitless and runless. During the first four innings it was three up and three down. In the fifth Kofch broke the spell with a circuit smash that fell going over the right field wall. Two other hits in the same inning, however, netted the Bears nothing.

Kinston scored first in the first inning. Bar coming across on a delayed steal of second by Johnson, which prompted the catcher to throw the ball to the keystone sack.

The winning run was scored in the 11th after Ollinger had been sent in to relieve Larisey. The first batter was a messy out but Duncan beat out a bunt. Ollie threw to first any way and the ball went wild. F. Morris then drew a walk and Kofch again did business when he hit Ollie wearing Duncan from second.
