

BOLL WEEVIL IN

EASTERN CAROLINA

Kinston, Sept. 17.—Inroads of the boll weevil upon the cotton crop in some sections not far distant from here are described by travelers as devastating. Mrs. Louis N. Williams, visiting in a Georgia county, declares she has been informed that the county's recent average production of 15,000 bales a year has been reduced by the insects until it is doubtful if 150 bales will be made in the entire county this year. The devastation has been astonishing on the large plantation where Mrs. Williams was being visited. A LaGrange tobaccoist returning from Scotland county, of which Laurinburg is the seat, brought with him weevils in a bottle. The inclusion of Scotland in the "weevil zone" brings the pest to within 100 miles of Kinston in that direction, while hundreds of the insects have been found and reported authoritatively identified in the vicinity of Richlands, only 27 miles in an air line to the northward. It is stated and propagates at a rate to insure rapid investment of the fields in which it makes its appearance.
