Good Roads Party of Tennessee is Touring Carolina

Charlotte, July 9.—(By the Associated Press.)—Governor Austin Peay, of Tenn., who is on a tour of inspection of North Carolina highways, and is accompanied by North Carolina and South Carolina good roads enthusiasts, left here today for High Point. The party is to visit Winston-Salem, Greensboro, Durham, Chapel Hill and Raleigh before returning to Charlotte Wednesday evening.

Proposals for linking up the highway systems of the Carolinas and Tennessee were discussed by officials of the three States during a conference in Asheville Saturday which was attended by Governors Peay and Morrison.

St. Joseph, Mo., July 9.—(By the Associated Press.)—Lieutenant R. L. Mangham was forced down at 1:10 p. m., Central time, 20 miles northeast of here when his engine "went dead". The aviator was uninjured, but his plane was so badly damaged he said he would be unable to continue his flight. Mangham said he would make another start from New York in a week or ten days.

FURTHER LOSSES IN THE COTTON MARKET

Liverpool Makes Poor Showing and Weather Is Unfavorable.

New York, July 9.—(By the Associated Press.)—The cotton market opened steady at an advance of one point on July, but generally 19 to 27 points lower, in response to the poor showing of Liverpool and the unfavorable weather news. July sold at 27.04 at the start, but quickly eased off to 26.75 after the execution of a few over-Sunday buying orders, and the general list soon showed net losses of 25 to 35 points, with October declining to 23.45 and December to 22.97.

LARGE ATTENDANCE AT THE CONVENTION

Both Sunday Schools in Williamsboro Township Well Represented.

The township Sunday school convention for Williamsboro township, held last Friday at Island Creek Baptist church, was declared a decided success. Both Island Creek and Hicks schools were well represented at the convention, and the attention was pronounced splendid. Rev. J. R. Cantrell, of Wake Forest, pastor of South Henderson Baptist church, spoke on "Five Wise Methods of Bible Study." Professor G. C. Davidson illustrated his talk on buying a new Bible by using four copies of the Bible shown. It was felt that his address should have been heard by many other persons.

C. H. Oliver spoke on the King James Version of the Bible, and a comparison to the American revision was also given. The replies of the audiences on the Bible drill on Fashion Week in the Savior's Life indicated the attention which was given to this number, notice being taken of the use of this event as a center around which to group the facts of the last chapters of the four gospels. The story of David and Goliath, made real by the simplest marks on the board, held fine attention of the audience.

Rev. H. A. Ellis was prevented from addressing the convention by an accident to his automobile in bringing boys back from the Y. M. C. A. camp Friday morning.

S. E. Wilson was chosen president and Hamitt Guerrant secretary of the township association.

ROANOKE RAPIDS WINNER SATURDAY

One of the hardest fought games of the season was lost by the Henderson club last Saturday at Roanoke Rapids, the Trinity-Roanoke Rapids outfit winning by the close score of 3 to 2. The game was clean and hard-fought, not an error being made by either side. Laundry's line drive for three bases with Bill Holding on first was the feature of the game. Bill Towse's high fly over the left field fence with Smith on the path in the fifth inning saved the Trinity nine from another defeat at the hands of the local club. The fence proved a good ploy for the Roanoke Rapids club, and prevented Webster or Winston from pulling it down.

The game is looked upon by the Henderson fans as being further evidence of the caliber of baseball the locals are putting out, and which they feel merits the support of the Henderson people.

STORM CAUSES HEAVY DAMAGE TO PITT CROPS
Greenville, July 7.—As the result of a devastating wind and hail storm passing through Pitt county this afternoon, several thousand dollars damage was done in various sections.

In one community, about five miles from Greenville on the north side of Tar River, damage of property thirty and forty thousand dollars was done within a radius of about two miles. There were about one hundred acres of tobacco literally destroyed by hail and wind and probably a similar number of acres of cotton and corn. On the farm of W. J. Fleming a small barn filled with corn was hit by the lightning and burned. His horse stables, in which there were four valuable mules, and one horse, were also struck, killing all five of the animals.
