Reconstruction Finance Body Would Help State

dition. The individual borrower and bank depositor will secure relief through the increased ability on the part of the banks to secure cash with which to carry on the normal business of banking.

"Under present conditions, safe banking practice makes it necessary for banks to maintain an unusually large cash reserve because of the nervousness of depositors. This retards the making of loans other than on paper immediately convertible into cash. The governmental agency proposed in this bill will give assurance to banks and other financial institu-

tions that all the cash needed will be forthcoming and the large cash reserve requirement will be eliminated. "Right now the farmer, merchant, business man and manufacturer are restricted in their operations because of inability to meet their obligations and to secure additional operating capital, even though their indebtedness is amply secured. Under the provisions of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation Act, banks will be permitted to borrow such funds as are needed and use these obligations as collateral security, thus being able to carry present obligations and make such additional loans as may be necessary to enable these individuals and enterprises to return to a normal basis and to provide employment for a larger number of people." Under Section 5 of the new Act,

the corporation is authorized to make loans to closed banks where such loans will restore the banks to solvency. Mr. LaRoque pointed out. Under this provision it is probable that a large number of banks in North Carolina which are in a solvent condition but which have recently closed because of the lack of confidence on the part of the public will be able to secure sufficient funds so that they can soon reopen. For the corporation will not require strictly liquid collateral, but only collateral that is safe and which can reasonably be expected to be paid within three to five years.
