THE RISE OF JAPAN

A Sketch Story of the Sun-Origin Kingdom—No. 3

After Perry's visit several ports were opened to foreign trade and in 1860 a Japanese embassy visited the United States. Narrow-minded patriots protested, but the great clans of the southwest gathered about the court. Men with new ideas obtained control of the empire and began the abolition of feudalism.

A new Japan was created, educators from the United States reorganized the educational system, French officers were imported to remodel the army, the British reorganized the navy, and Dutch and other engineers made internal improvements. Western laws were introduced into the country and codified.

These tremendous changes were not accomplished without protest, however. As a direct result the Satsuma rebellion broke out which cost Japan 20,000 lives and \$50,000,000. But the tide of progress continued. In 1889 the constitution was proclaimed and the diet met in 1891. The nobility was organized on the European idea.

In 1894 war with China broke out in regard to Korea. The war resulted in the complete defeat of China. Formosa was ceded to Japan, Korea was declared independent, and the Japanese were paid a large indemnity. Japan's decisive triumph gave notice to the world of the rise of a new power in the east.

Then the Japanese diplomats entered on a series of treaty negotiations which were to admit the nation to full equality with the great powers through the abolition of the obnoxious consular courts. Great Britain and the United States were the first to abandon the principle of extra-territoriality.

From the time of the Chinese war resentment against Russia had been rising throughout the empire. Russia was the leader of the Triple Alliance which had deprived Japan of the greater share of the fruits of victory. An early Japan turned an alliance with England. War with Russia seemed sure.
