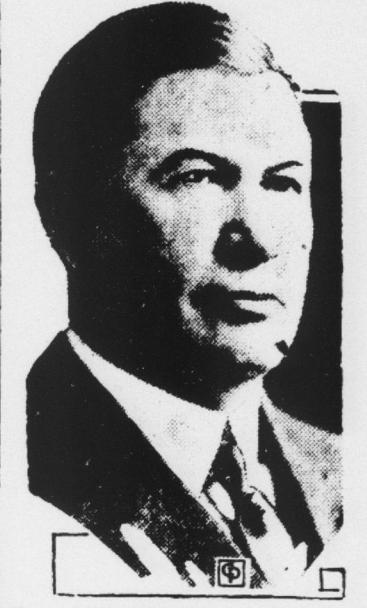
LAND TAX SALE IN MISSISSIPPI HIGH
