FARM PROGRAM IS MAKING HEADWAY

Many Individuals Returned To Farm Work; Employment Total 21,956

Raleigh, May 20.—The "Farm Improvement and Subsistence Program" which was launched several weeks ago in this State by the American Legion (Employment Committee in cooperation with North Carolina State College, is making good headway.

For the net two weeks Major Paul R. Younts, the assistant director of the National Employment Commission, will make a tour of the State in the interest of the employment drive and will urge the various posts visited to take an active part in returning to the farms as many agricultural workers to the farms as possible.

The following cities have obtained over one thousand jobs each: Asheville, 1,168; Charlotte, 3,365; Greensboro, 1,669; High Point, 1,292; Kannapolis, 1,283; Morehead City, 1,638; Wilmington, 1,063; Winston-Salem, 1,135.

The grand total for the United States is 780,747 jobs since the opening of the War Against Depression.
