At the same time, it was announced today that a meeting had been called for next Tuesday, July 5, of stockholders of the new bank. At that time it is expected a board of directors will elected, and other business transactd. Soon thereafter a call will be made to all new stockholders for the immediate payment of their stock.

No date for the opening of the bank has been fixed as yet, pending adjustment of necessary preliminaries, but it is hoped that it can get under way by the first of August, or thereabouts, if not sooner than that.

Stock in the new bank was sold in the amount of \$100,000, but was sold at the price of \$120 a share, so as to create a surplus of \$20,000 at the open ing. The new bank has promised to pay in full at the opening all depositors with \$20 or less in the old bank, and to pay all other depositors at that time ten percent of the money hey had when the old bank closed, The new directors will elect the cf- them in one, two and three years.
