#### 1932 COTTON CROP THIRD UNDER 1931 IN U. S. FORECAST

Production of 11,306,000 Bales Likely, Compared With 17,096,000 Bales In 1931

#### CONDITION OF CROP 65.6 PCNT. NORMAL

Last Year at This Time Condition Was Given as 75 percent; Yield Per Acre Fourth Under Last Year; North Carolina Yield Put At 509,000 Bales

New York, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Cotton prices soared more than \$5 a bale on the New York market today, following publication of the government crop estimates, forecasting a crop about 1,000,000 bales smaller than had been expected by traders.

#### STILL SOME WORRY OVER SELECTION OF A STATE CHAIRMAN

Reynolds' Indecision As To Winborne Portends Possible Strife In The Committee

The probable disagreement of Candidates Ehringhaus and Reynolds ramifies as the characters are studied. Mr. Winborne is an eastern man. He came from the Albemarle section. He had since leaving college in Marion, McDowell county. He is eastern and western, is well equipped to harmonize the differing economic ideas.
