The county home cost in the State is a big item in the budget. It is the largest item in the budget of most counties. The cost of maintaining the county home is a heavy burden on the taxpayers.

The solution of the high cost of county homes is the establishment of district county homes with farms in connection, according to Brown and Whitley, who point out that not more than 50 poor homes are needed for the entire state and that 35 or 40 could probably take care of the situation.

The county that had the highest per capita county home cost in 1930 was Avery, with a per capita cost of \$418 for only 12 inmates. The county with the lowest per capita cost was Bertie with \$28 for 2 inmates.

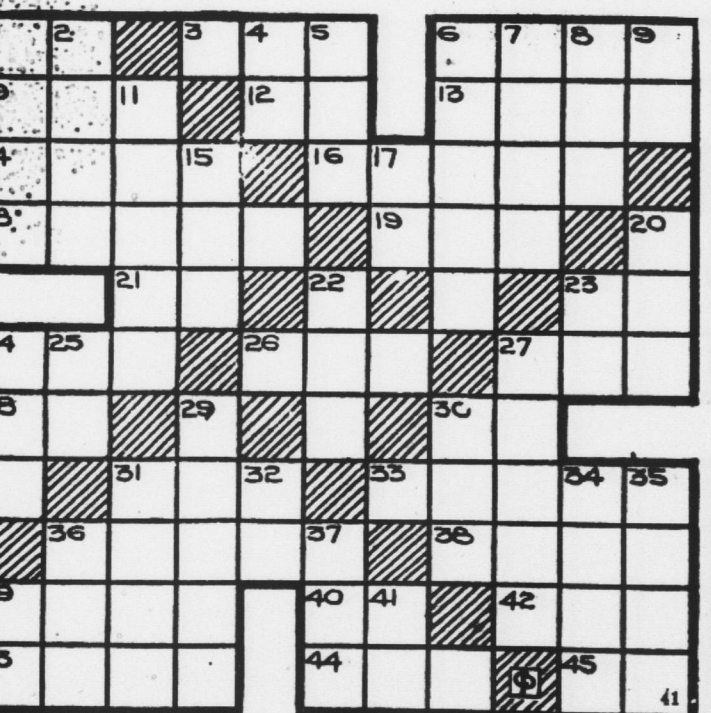
Much interest is being shown in the rally here tonight at which Reynolds and Ehringhaus will speak under the auspices of the Wake County Young Democratic Club.
