Tremendous Majority For Democrats In State Seen

Several who have recently reported a steady growth of sentiment in favor of the Democratic party in all these counties and predict that 400,000 votes will be cast for the Democratic candidates in the November election.

SEPTEMBER INCOME FOR STATE HIGHER

But Total For First Quarter Less Than Same Period Last Year

Daily Dispatch Bureau, Raleigh, Oct. 1.—A total of \$878,964 of state revenue for the general fund was collected during September, as compared with only \$290,782 collected in September, 1931, according to figures announced today by Commissioner of Revenue A. J. Maxwell. This brings the total revenue collections for the first three months of the present fiscal year to \$4,185,520 as compared with collections of \$3,678,427 for the corresponding months in 1931.
