LUCY CLOSS PARKER SOCIETY WILL MEET

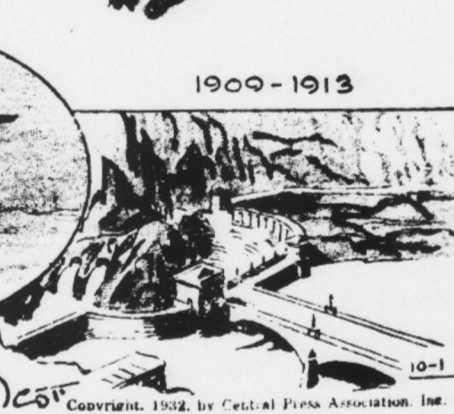

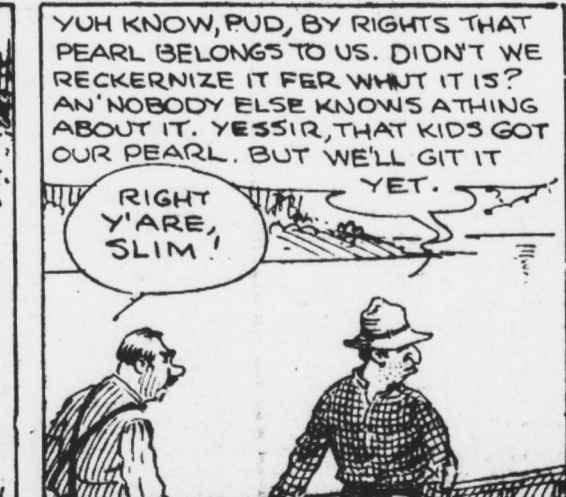
