Phoenix Lumberman Alleged to Have Attempted to Conceal Murders in Arizona City.

MURDER CASE UP TO U. S. SUPREME COURT

Will Be in Form of Writ of Certiorari and Will Allege Winnie Ruth Judd Did Not Get Fair Trial in Superior or Supreme Courts of Arizona

Phoenix, Ariz., Dec. 30.—(AP)—J. J. Haloran, Phoenix lumberman and spokesman, was indicated by the grand jury today in connection with the Winnie Ruth Judd murder case, and shortly afterwards accepted a bench warrant charging he was an accessory in the slaying of Agnes Anne Leroy and Hedvig Samuelson.

Haloran appeared at the court house and posted \$3,000 bond. He was released pending preliminary hearing next Tuesday.

Streams in State Are Now Receding in Most Sections

Raleigh, Dec. 30.—(AP)—North Carolina streams today were receding into their banks in their middle and upper sections as a day and night of more rain was predicted, but the lower reaches of the eastern rivers were still in flood. Turbulent waters of yesterday in Western North Carolina streams had moved down into South Carolina.

Lee A. Denson, in charge of the United States Weather Bureau here, said more rain was the prediction for the State, but that no further flood conditions were expected unless the precipitation was heavy. The slight overflows this week have done very little damage.

Business In 1933 Will Be Ten Percent Better Than 1932, Babson Says

Under Double Lift of Bigger Volume and Higher Prices, It Will Be 15 Percent Better; Will Be More Jobs; Final Opportunity for Investments

I refer to the volume of business, measured in tons, bushels, gallons, dozens, and other units of quantity. There is another way to look at business, namely,

its money value in dollars. In general, prices in 1933 will tend to advance. Hence, under the double lift of bigger volume and higher prices, the dollar amount of business this coming year will total at least 15 per cent above that of 1932. I am not stating these definite percentages with
