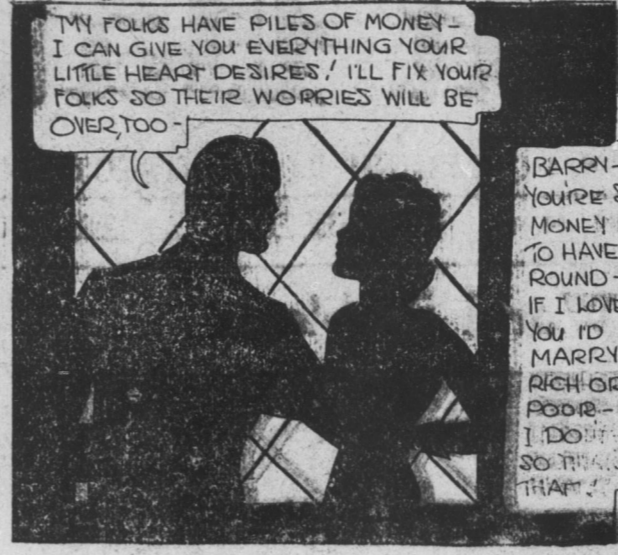

Seven persons were wounded in five cities in Cuba yesterday before military forces took over control.

In Germany another clash occurred between National Socialists and Communists in Berlin yesterday. Many were injured and police were met with a volley of gun fire before the fight was broken up.

In the Irish Free State, where more than 30 persons were injured in political fights Sunday, General Owen O'Duffy, chief of the civil guard, said he would call out the army if other efforts to maintain peace failed.

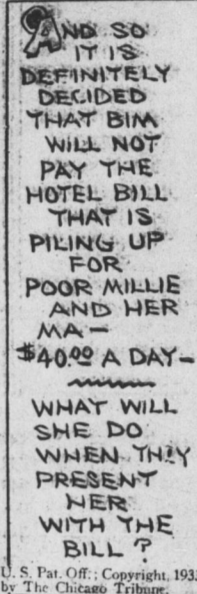

TO OPPOSE LIMITS ON BUDGET POWERS

smarting under the dictatorship of the budget commission. While few senators or representatives are willing to be quoted on the legislation pending, or its possible introduction, a survey by this bureau indicated that opposition to any bills hampering the operation of the budget law of 1925 will be sought to the last ditch. Particularly at this time, when revenues have been gradually but steadily declining, and necessitating a flexible method of fitting expenditures to actual revenue, sentiment in favor of continuance of the budget act is very strong.

Since the introduction of the budgetary control method during the McLean administration, appropriations and expenditures have steadily declined, the Budget Bureau apportioning out the appropriation funds to the various departments quarterly on the basis of incoming revenue, and scaling down appropriations to fit the actual needs of the departments. During 1931 appropriations amounted to something like \$29,000,000, whereas actual revenue amounted to approximately \$23,000,000. That year the budgetary control power vested with the governor and the Advisory Budget Commission enabled the scaling down of appropriations to \$26,000,000. Last year's revenue, it is estimated will be only around \$21,000,000, or \$8,000,000 less than the appropriations made by the 1931 legislature. During the biennium, the commission reduced expenditures by about \$7,500,000.

Thus, had it not been for the power which the 1925 law vested with the governor and the advisory commission, North Carolina's deficit would be a good many millions more than it actually is, as there would have been no way for the executive department to have put a check on outgoing money when it became apparent that there would not be nearly so much revenue as the legislature seemed to think.
