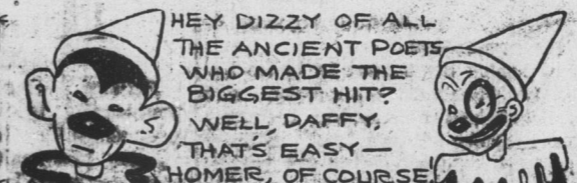


PREACHED THE LONGEST SERMON - 12 HRS AND 10 MINS.
