CITIES FAILED TO SLICE ROAD FUND

Inability of Municipalities to Agree Explains Their Failure

Raleigh, May 22.—The cities and towns of the State failed in their efforts to get any of the highway fund, derived from the State tax on gasoline, for the maintenance of streets inside of city limits, despite the numerous bills introduced in the General Assembly along these lines, it was pointed out today by Chairman E. B. Jeffress of the State Highway Commission. The reason for this failure according to Jeffress, was the inability of the representatives of the cities and towns to agree on any one particular plan.

"The General Assembly would have passed the bill requiring the State Highway Commission to maintain the streets over which State highways are routed through cities and towns, but for the fact that many of the cities and towns wanted more than this bill gave them," Jeffress said, "As a result, they ended up by getting nothing."

The bill requiring the highway commission to maintain the streets over which State highways are routed through cities and towns, for the same with of pavement as that of the highways, passed the house and for a time seemed sure of passing the senate. But the various cities and towns, through the North Carolina Municipal Association, wanted much more than this bill would have given. In fact, this organization of municipal officials, wanted the highway commission to allot 10 per cent of all the revenue collected from the gasoline tax to the cities and towns to be used

by them in maintaining their streets and a bill was introduced along these lines. Still another bill would have maintained all the streets in towns of 5,000 population or less.

But the General Assembly saw that these measures would have diverted at least \$1,000,000 a year from highway maintenance in the cities and towns of the State, and refused to enact them. As a result, by trying to get too much, the cities and towns passed up the chance to get some street maintenance and ended up by getting nothing at all.

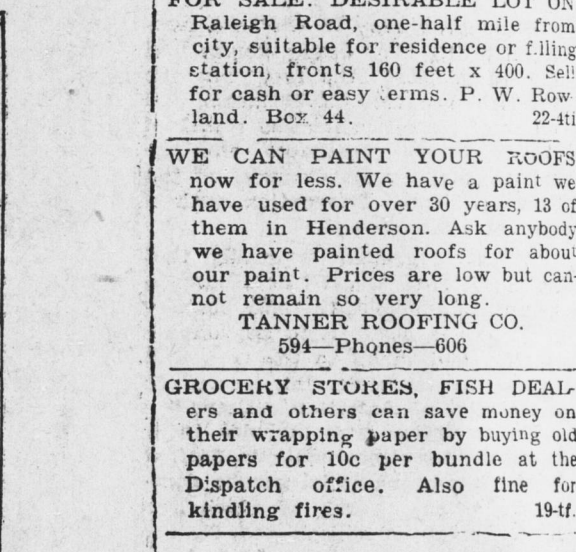

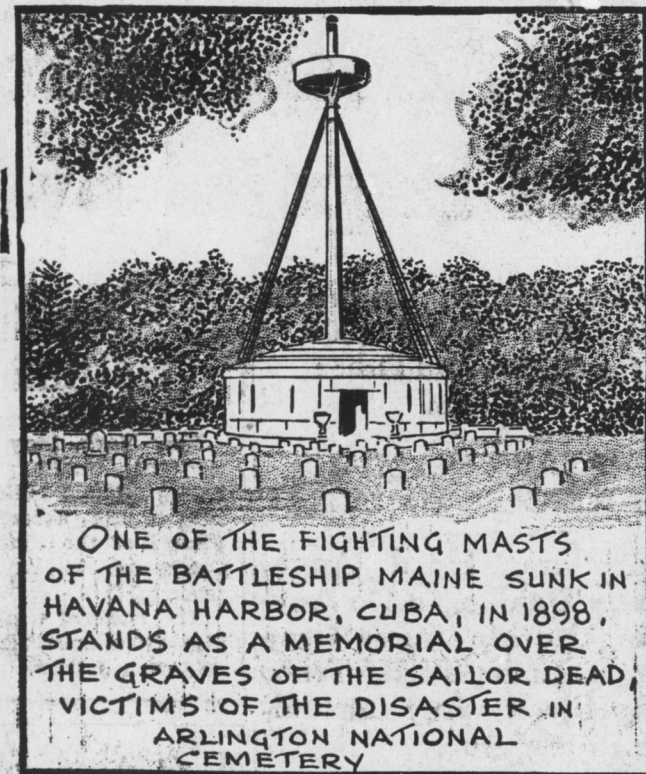

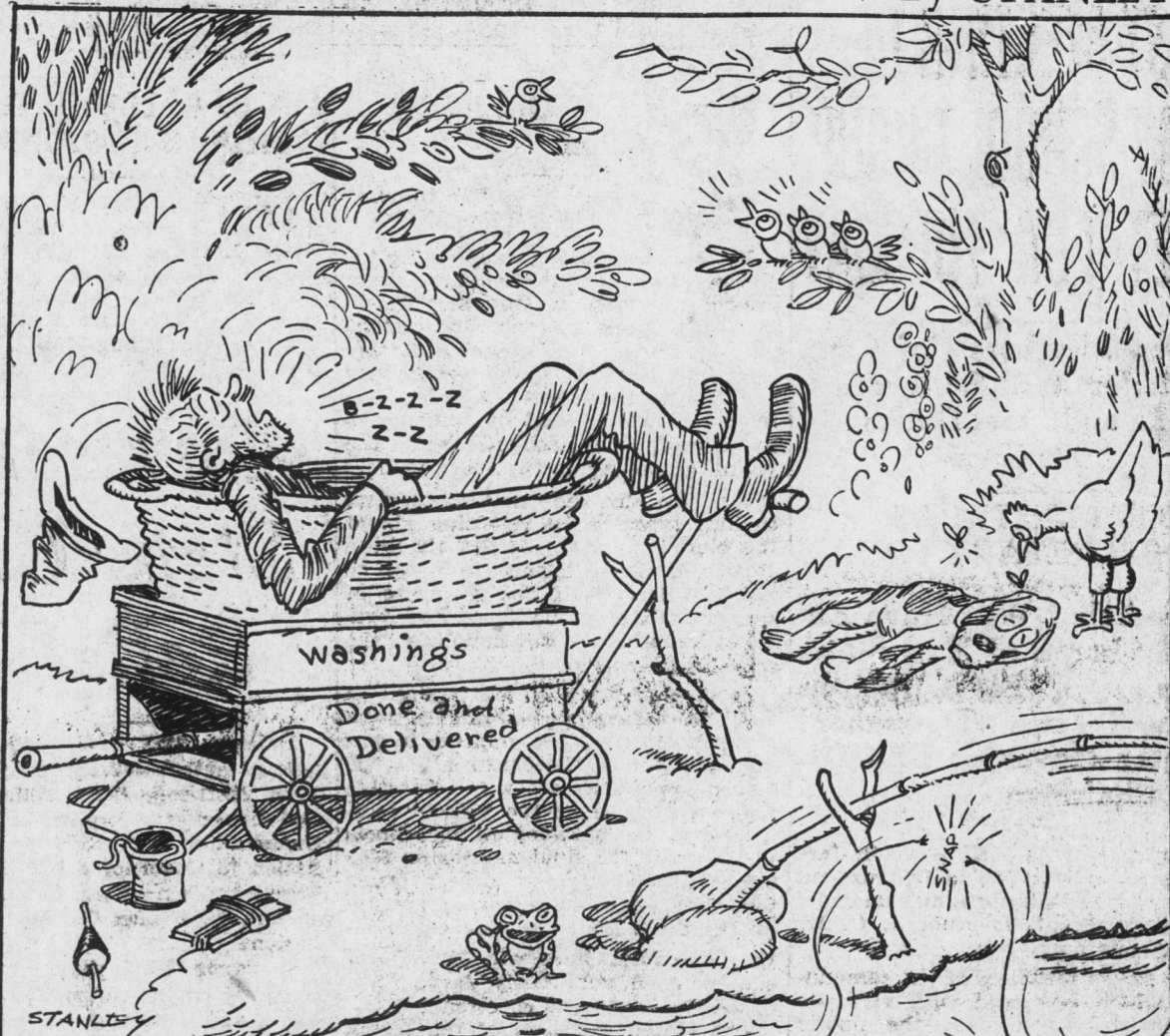
