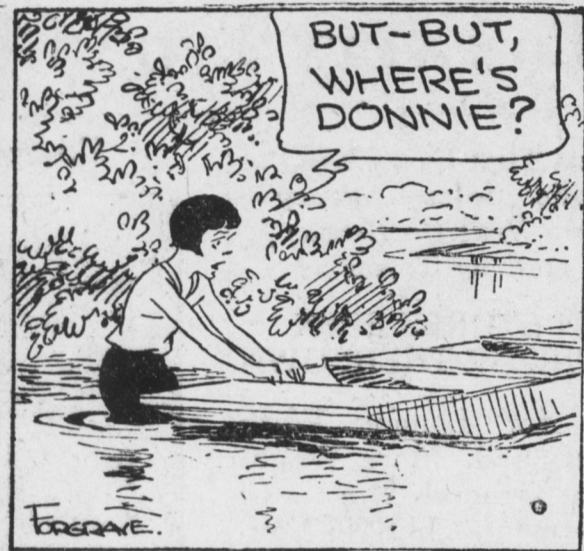

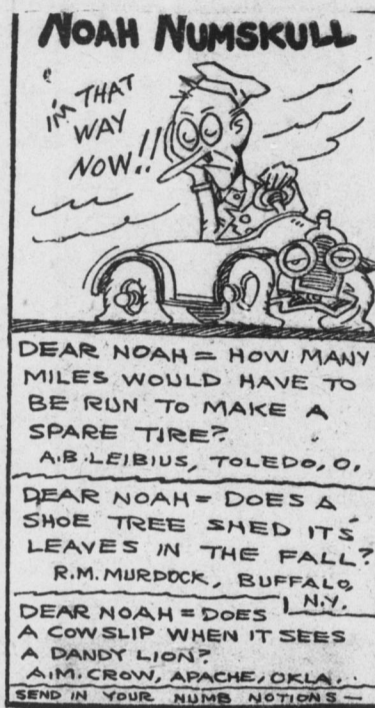

Cosmetics Group Protests Naming Of State Board

Raleigh, Aug. 1.—(AP)—Representatives of the Association of Cosmetologists of North Carolina, an organization of persons practicing cosmetic arts in beauty parlors of the State, this afternoon were scheduled to protest to Governor J. C. B. Ehringhaus the appointment of two of the three members of the State's Cosmetic Art Board. About 200 members of the association, which was authorized under a 1933 State law, met here last night and set up the body. A resolution was adopted petitioning the governor to rescind his appointment of Arthur T. Ritchie, of Asheville, and J. L. Smithey, of Reidsville as members of the cosmetologists board.

The chairman still gets the complaints. Evidently the hundreds of jobless Democrats feel that if there are any offices to hand out these should gravitate to men and women who were regular in 1928 and without apology for the way they voted. It is an increasingly popular song that these Democrats sing! It got its first rise when Robert R. Reynolds opened on Senator Cameron Morrison for voting to confirm Frank R. McNinch as power commissioner, and the rivalry was higher as the attack became sharper. Until times became so hard and jobs were at such a premium there was little disposition to follow up the 1928 vote. But there is nothing the average Democrat brags so little about as that bolting which in 1928 turned North Carolina Republican.
