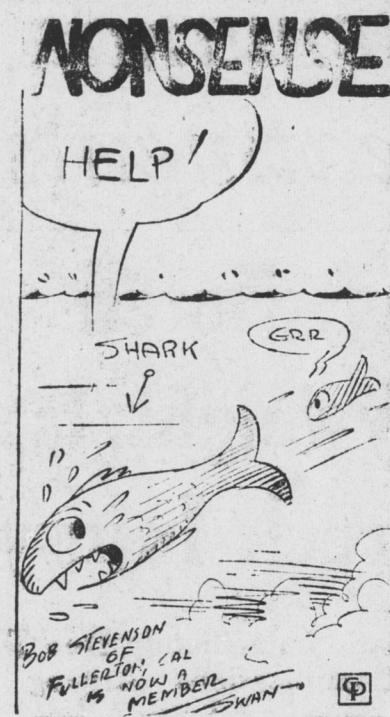
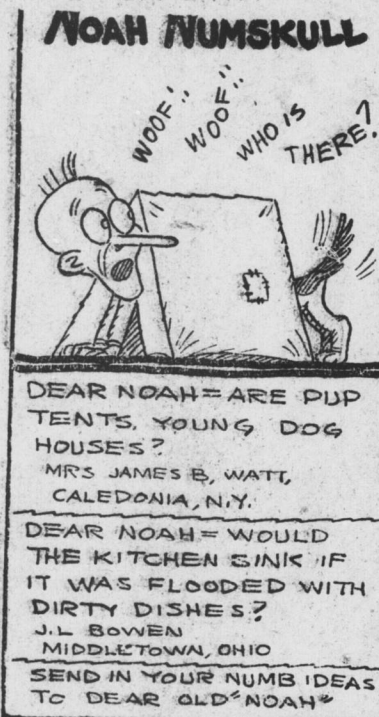

Raleigh, Oct. 3.—Every indication points to a successful State Fair here during the week beginning October 9, Norman H. Campbell, secretary-manager, said today in talking over the prospects for the annual October exposition.

In addition to the many free act features at the State Fair, including the Winter Garden Revue, featuring pretty girls in gorgeous costumes, the World of Mirth Shows will exhibit on the midway and Mr. Chambliss said these shows will not only be clean, but entertaining in every respect.

Considerable interest is being manifested, according to members of the Raleigh Junior League, in the revival of the State Fair Marshals' Parade and Ball, old time features of State Fair Week.

Congressman Walter Lambeth, of Thomasville, the State's only bachelor member of Congress and also the youngest member of the delegation, has accepted the Junior League's invitation to be chief marshal of the State Fair Marshals' Parade and Ball. The parade is to be held Monday afternoon at 4 o'clock of Fair Week and the ball, with Hal Kemp, a native North Carolinian, and his orchestra providing music, is expected to draw a Statewide gathering here of the social element.

The State Fair this year is giving away \$10,000 in prize awards to farmers, farmwomen and others and indications now point to a floral ball filled to capacity. All of the exhibit space with two or three exceptions has already been sold.

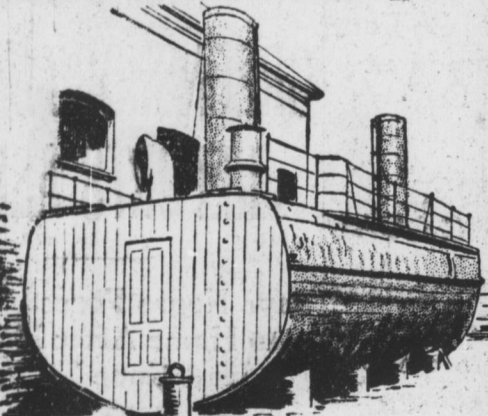

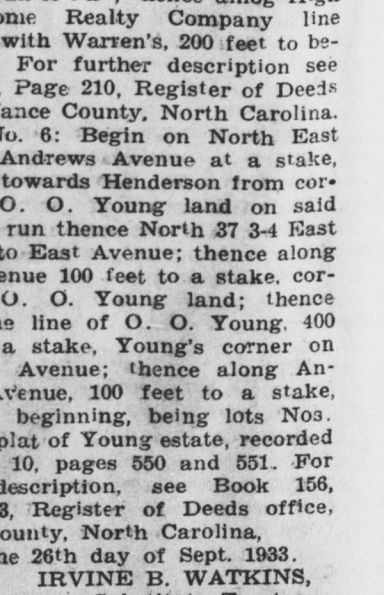
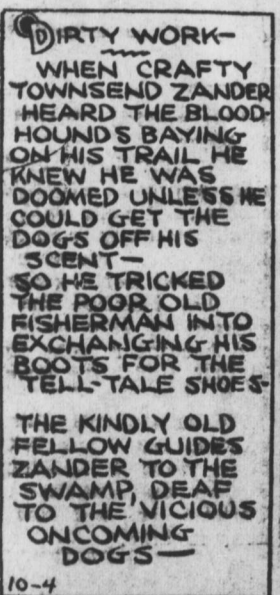

Lot No. 1: Begin at a stake on Andrews Avenue, 500 feet from Pinkston Street; run thence along the line of lot No. 7, 200 feet to a stake; thence parallel with Andrews Avenue, 50 feet to a stake, corner of lots Nos. 3 and 4; thence along line of lot No. 3, 200 feet to Andrews Avenue; thence along Andrews Avenue, 50 feet to the beginning, being lot No. 3 as shown on plat in Book "A," Page 17, Register of Deeds office of Vance County, N. C. also see Deed Book 62, Page 572.

Lot No. 2: Begin at a stake on Andrews Avenue, corner Mrs. Nellie Bridges corner; run along said line North 52 West 50 feet to a stake; thence North 37 3-4 East, 200 feet to a stake; thence South 37 3-4 West, 200 feet to beginning. For further description see Book 98, Page 411, Register of Deeds office, Vance County, North Carolina.

Lot No. 3: Begin at a stake, Andrews Avenue, Parham corner; run thence North 52 East, 100 feet to a stake; thence North 37 3-4 West, 200 feet to a stake; thence South 52 East 100 feet to a stake, Parham corner; thence 37 3-4 West, 200 feet to the beginning. For further description see Book 98, Page 26, Register of Deeds office, Vance County, North Carolina.

Lot No. 4: Begin at a point on East Avenue, 600 feet from Pinkston Avenue; run along said East Avenue, 100 feet toward Andrews Avenue, 200 feet to Nellie Bridges corner; thence parallel to East Avenue, 100 feet along line of Mrs. Bridges to back corner; thence 200 feet to place of beginning, being lot No. 4 of Young property. See Book 11, page 81, Register of Deeds office, Vance County, North Carolina.

Lot No. 5: Begin on South edge of East Street (The Highland Home corner lot), thence along Mathew Warren line towards Fair Ground Street 200 feet; thence along Daniel's line parallel with East Street 50 feet to Highland Home Realty Company corner in Daniel line; thence along Highland Home Realty Company line parallel with Warren's, 200 feet to beginning. For further description see Book 56, Page 210, Register of Deeds office, Vance County, North Carolina.

Lot No. 6: Begin on North East side of Andrews Avenue at a stake, 100 feet towards Henderson from corner of O. O. Young land on said Avenue; run thence North 37 3-4 East 400 feet to East Avenue; thence along East Avenue 100 feet to a stake, corner of O. O. Young; thence along the line of O. O. Young, 400 feet to a stake, Young's corner on Andrews Avenue; thence along Andrews Avenue, 100 feet to a stake, place of beginning, being lots Nos. 1 and 2, plat of Young estate, recorded in Book 10, pages 550 and 551. For further description, see Book 156, Page 278, Register of Deeds office, Vance County, North Carolina.
