



State Sells \$3,304,-000 Bonds 2.72 (Continued from Page One.)

of Boston rate was 2,734 percent, with total cost of \$694,263.50. The Council of State met this afternoon to confirm the sale. There were six bidders.

The previous low interest rate received by the State for bonds was 3.76 percent on an issue of \$12,230,_ 000 sold June 12, 1934.

The average rate for bonds sold prior to that date and now outstanding is 4.32 percent.

Today's securities were sold to fund the balance of the "Gardner deficit" created prior to June 30, 1933, and the ssue sold last June was also to fund a part of it. By not issuing the full amount of bonds a year ago, Charles M. Johnson, State treasurer, said, the State has been saving more than \$5,-

000 per month. Buyers participating in the sale expressed the opinion the sale was 'wonderful," and "one of the best in the country.'

Raleigh, June 21.- Doctors who confess their limited knowledge of infantile paralysis observe that despite the restrictions on crowds the disease spreads where there are no crowds.

Figures are not availble in specific cases, but it is observed that rural places suffer more by the spread than do the towns There have been In Sparse Regions orders closing schools, limiting attendance on many public functions and the disease seems to seek out the sparser communities. The efforts seem to be effective in other ways. The disease is nothing like emalignant as it at first prom-ised to be. The health people are more adept at finding i out and treatment in time seems to be efficasious. The doctors still advise against big public congregations and the young people are right much upset over a possible abandonment of the big balls during the remainder of the month. The number of complete cures has been remarkably large and if the campaign against the disease has not headed off the spread it has helped to bring hope to stricken families. But the men of science are still unable to fathom the queer conduct of a malady which seems most dangerous in crowds and at the same time seems to find a natural trend toward the more sparsely settled districts.
