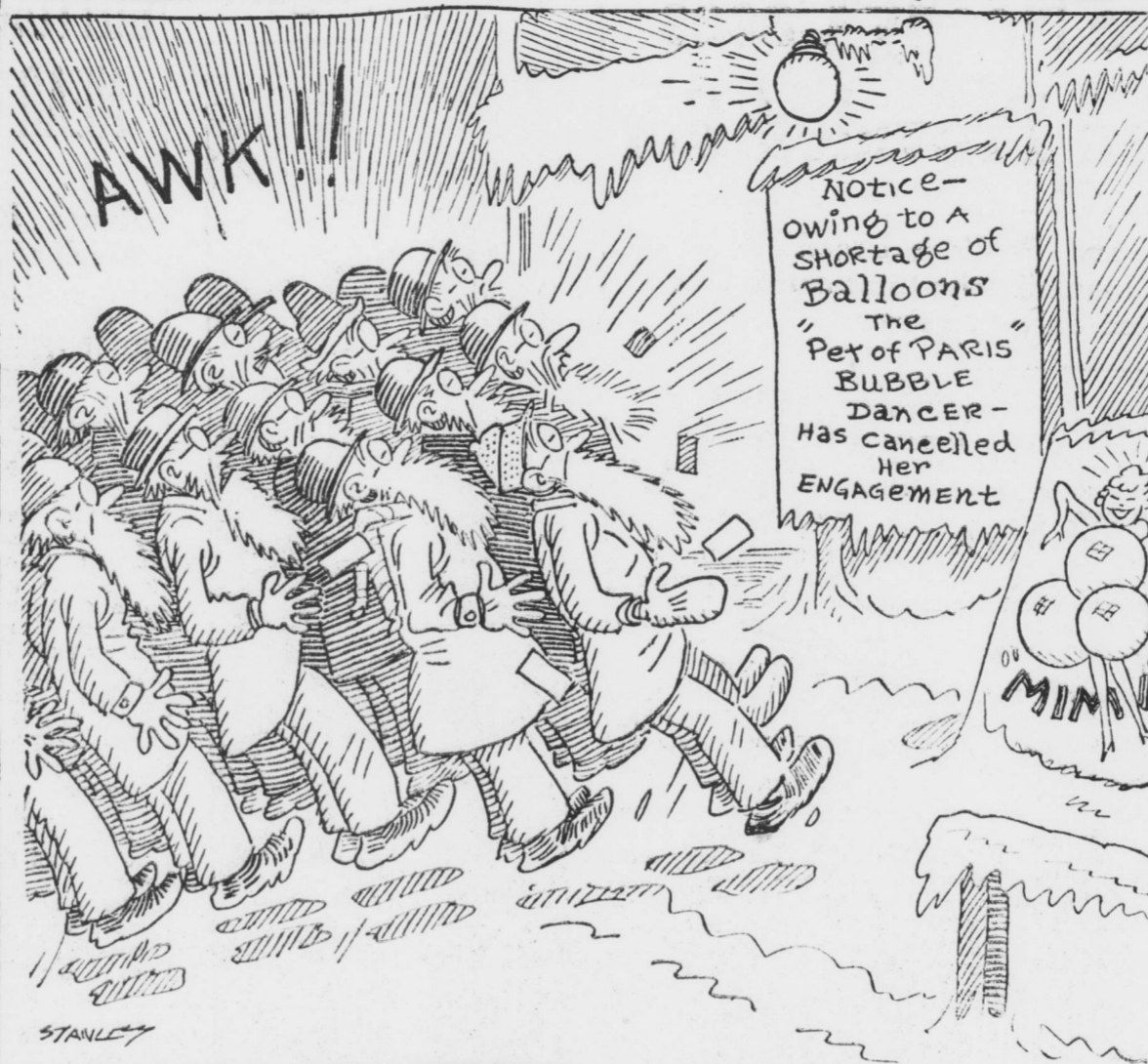

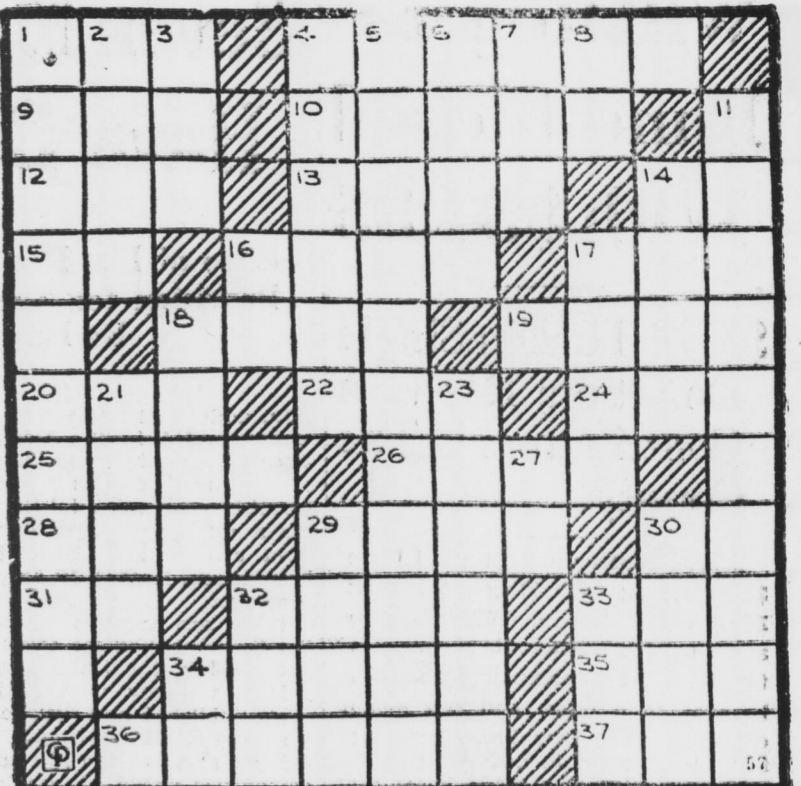

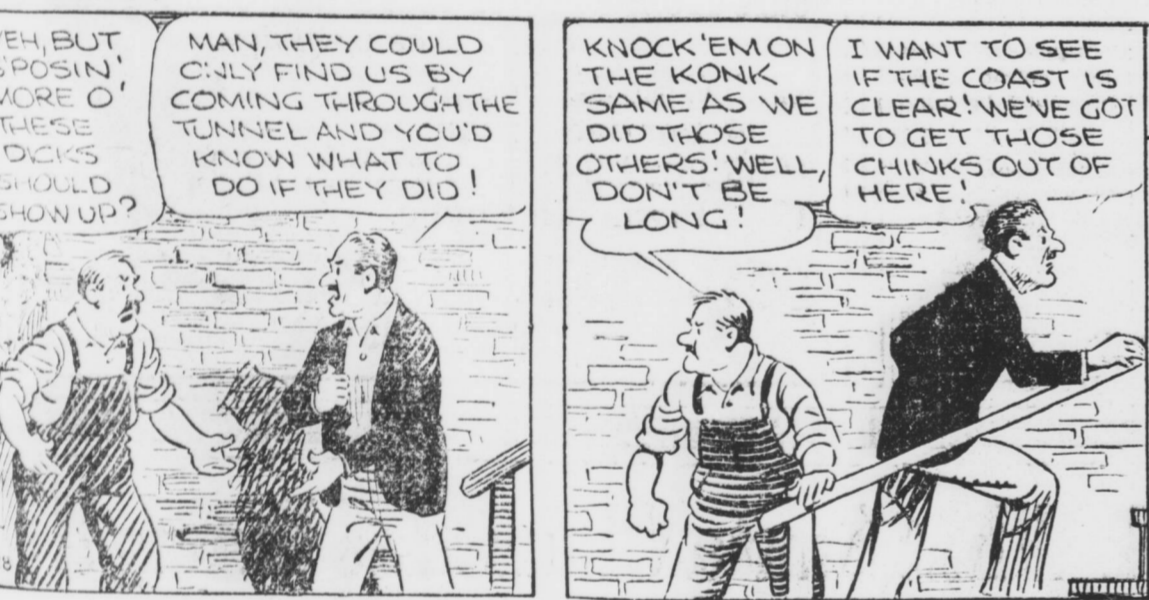

CONTRACT BRIDGE WRITTEN FOR CENTRAL PRESS By E. V. SHEPARD FAMOUS BRIDGE TEACHER

IS A SMALL SLAM POSSIBLE? A SMALL SLAM is not often bid against an adverse no trump call, but today we have an excellent example of such a case. North had a large contract on his hands, but he certainly played the cards of his side with great skill. The gallery watched his work with great interest, questioning among themselves whether or not the contract could be fulfilled. Dummy's Ace won, leaving both dummy and declarer with two losers in clubs. Having for an even break in trumps, declarer won the next two tricks with the K and Q of spades. East showed out on the second round, marking West's original holding of three spades. Dummy ran off two winning hearts. On the second one declarer led one of his losing clubs. The Ace of diamonds was led, enabling dummy to ruff itself back on a diamond. The J of hearts was led. West's 1-No Trump bid announced possession of the Q, and he overtook with it. Declarer ruffed. Dummy was put in through ruffing a low diamond. On dummy's good 9 of hearts declarer discarded his last club. Now declarer was able to count just one more diamond in West's hand. Another ruff of diamonds by dummy must establish declarer's Q. If West held the lone K, as expected, declarer led a club from dummy and ruffed, a trick next to his last trump. Each player was down to his last three cards. Declarer led one of his diamonds. Dummy's last trump won. West's K fell and declarer's Q became good. The long heart was led from dummy. West was ruffed. He held only the J of trumps and the K of clubs. If he trumped, declarer's Ace would win the twelfth trick and his good diamond would yield a grand slam. If West did not trump, declarer would discard his good diamond and the last trick must be won by the K of trumps. North not only trilled his small slam contract, but a trick over.

How to Control Appetite During Holiday Season

By LOGAN CLENDENING, M. D. THIS TITLE has been suggested as an appropriate subject for the season. It is one about which it is easy to be dogmatic, but it is not very easy to be wise. The tendency for parents and guardians is to restrain a child from eating the delicacies which are likely to make the table groan at just this season and yet, except in extreme instances, probably very little harm is done. The answer also depends upon the child--its weight, whether it is overweight or underweight; its selective tendencies; its ability to use self-determination in controlling its food intake. The important thing is to see that the rich foods--mince pies and plum pudding--do not displace the necessary and wholesome, although not quite so attractive, foods. That, in fact, is true about any diet, whether it is a reducing diet or an increasing diet, diabetic diet, or what not. Be sure that the essential food elements are used, which means a variety of foods--milk, eggs, fruits, bread and butter, those vegetables which contain pigment and roughage. Another feature which is a help of other days might deserve some comment. I refer to the fact that the real dessert of the Christmas dinner is likely to be pastor oil. We can overdo young gourmands in the holiday season very readily. Instead of depending upon a cathartic the next day, wouldn't it be better to restrain the intake on Christmas day itself? For old and young, it is important during the holidays to get the proper quota of sunshine and exercise. In fact, to get a little more than the regular quota. The children will do this themselves, and that is why it is safer to let them indulge themselves than it is for an older person. Everything considered, I am really far more worried about the parents, uncles, aunts and grandparents, than I am about the children at the holiday tables.
