I met new evidence that, of all things in the world, a little kindness pays the largest dividends. People here and there told me of trivial acts of kindness completely gone from my memory that had held their gratitude through all the years.

BAILEY PROBABLY TO MAKE ADDRESS

Likely To Speak in Winston Following Snubs in His Home Town.

Raleigh, Jan. 6.—Senator Josiah W. Bailey is believed more likely to accept the invitation extended him by the Wilsonian Democratic Club of Winston-Salem to address their Jackson Day dinner Wednesday night, than any other, especially since many still think that Congressman Frank Hancock of the fifth district, which includes Forsyth county, may become a candidate for the Senate against Bailey.

But political observers here are inclined to believe that if it is at all possible, Senator Bailey will find a way to be present at the dinner in Winston-Salem.

The recent announcement by Solicitor Allen T. Gwynn, of Reidsville, that he will be a candidate for Congress from the fifth district, the one which Congressman Hancock now represents, is regarded by a good many as indicating Hancock will be a candidate against Senator Bailey.
