Drivers Try Hard To Have Licenses Restored to Them

Raleigh, May 28.—Drivers who have had their driving permits revoked for one year because of convictions for drunken driving or following two convictions for reckless driving, use every known trick in an effort to get their licenses restored or to obtain entirely new licenses, Director Arthur Fulk of the highway safety division

of the Department of Revenue, said today. But so far all of these tricks have failed, due to the fact that the highway safety division is taking no chances and is "wise" to most of the tricks which are tried.

The effort being made most frequently now by those who have had their driving licenses revoked is to make new applications in which they change their names or initials slightly, Fulk said. Within the last day or so a new application was received which seemed to look all right. But in all those whose licenses have been revoked or suspended. And when this was checked, the name was almost identical with that of a man whose license had been revoked only a few

weeks before. An initial had been inserted, where none had been used before, and the color of the hair was given as "red" instead of "sandy." Accordingly a highway patrolman was sent to investigate and found that the new application for a driver's license had been sent in by the same man whose permit had been revoked for one year. He was immediately indicted for attempting to secure a new license by fraudulent means and those charges are now pending against him.
