Nanking Denies War Is Declared Upon Japan by South China Government (Continued from Page One.)

branded the Japanese report as "propaganda."

Chinese authorities in Shanghai stated the relations at the present time between Canton and Nanking had "never been better." They added, "Canton and Nanking are on the verge of a complete union."

Recent indication from South China had been that the Chinese in that area, long politically opposed to the Nanking government, sought military opposition to the continued infiltration of Japanese from Formosa.

The southern Chinese, particularly the students, passed resolutions asking that Nanking take steps to block the increased Japanese military advances in North China.
