## WELDON BULLOCK TO GET OLYMPIC TRIAL

Weldon Bullock, Creedmoor's strong man, won out over weight lifters in New York June 14, and will sail for the Olympics in Germany July 14 if he wins final tests in Philadelphia July 4. May 10 in his first contest of the series in Cincinnati, he won first place by lifting from the ground 200 pounds and was awarded the 1936 championship medal. By lifting 310 pounds in the N. Y. trial of strength he won first place again. In three lifts he made the second highest rec-

ord ever made for Olympic contests in this country. He has a good reserve of lifting strength for the final contest in Philadelphia July 4 and feels his chances are good for the Olympics in Berlin.

The young athlete is the son of Mrs. Viola Bullock of Creedmoor, who is proud of her son's success in these tests of strength, but says she is prouder of his splendid record for three years as a student in Duke University.

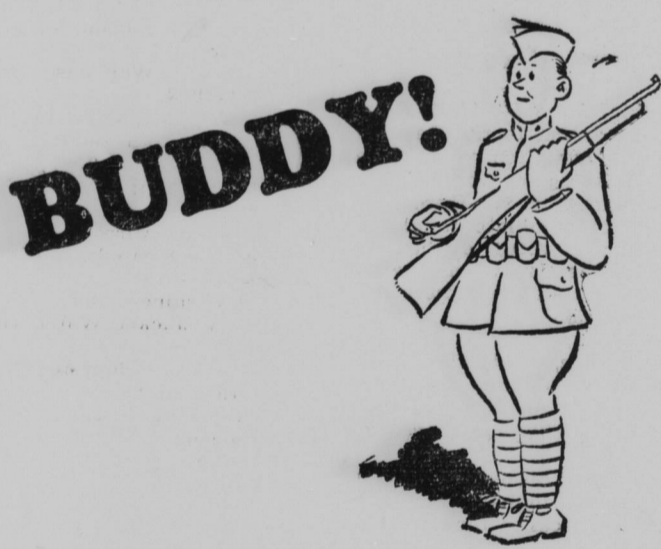
