A large number of supporters, including many students, will accompany the team to Charlottesville aboard a special train which leaves here early tonight and returns Friday.

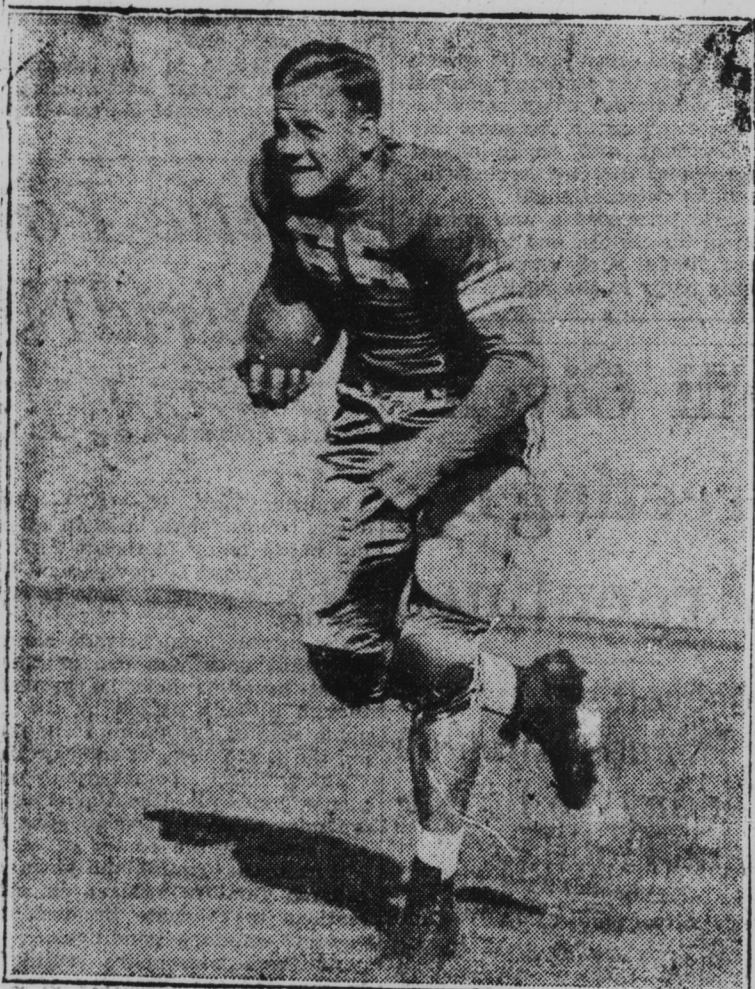
Industry must pay taxes on wages and payrolls, beginning January 1.

In addition to the monthly tax payments, each employer must make a quarterly "information return" on wages paid and to whom.

In addition, each employer is required to keep a record of his payroll beginning with January, for inspection of revenue officials.

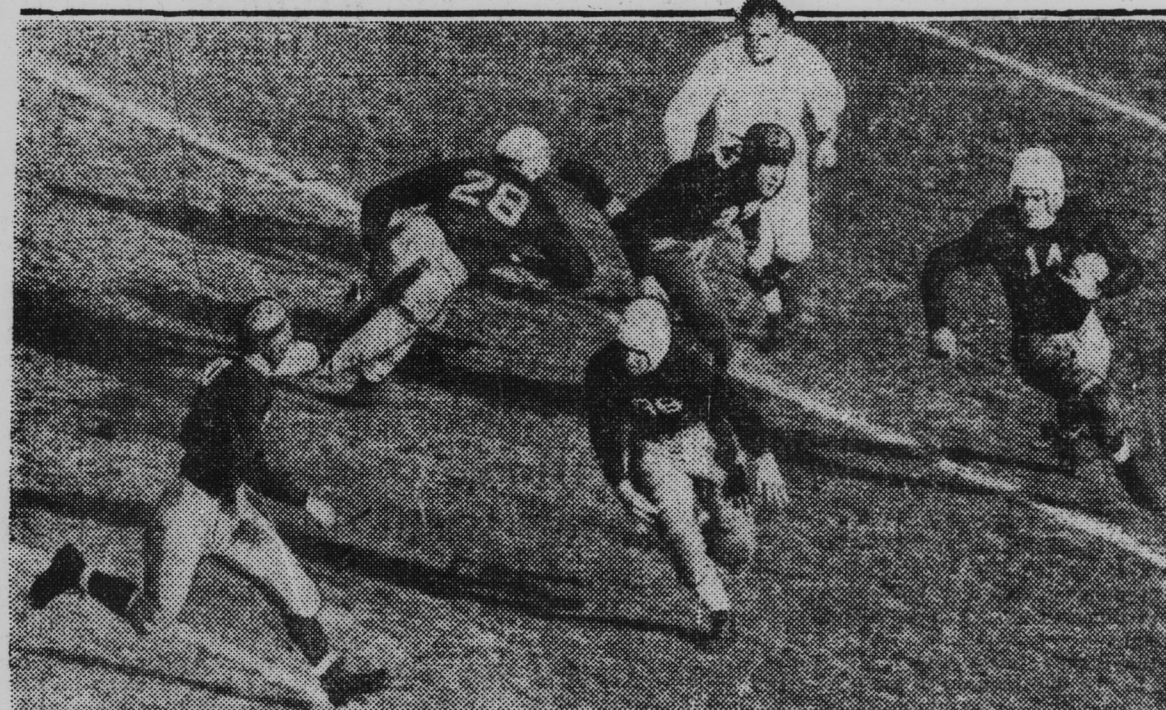
While Walton Kitchin and Porter Sheppard, halfbacks, are not in the opening club, it is expected that they will see a great deal of duty against the 'Cats.
