Rocky Mount, May 15.—(AP)—Dan Perry, 40, well known Nashville lawyer, who was re-elected mayor of Nashville recently while he lay dangerously ill in a local hospital, died here early today from complications after an operation.

Funeral services were to be conducted late this afternoon from the home in Nashville.

Born in Craven county, Perry went to Nashville in 1915, where he served as assistant to the clerk of superior court, vice recorder and recorder of county court.
