LITTLE FAVORED AS HEELS QUARTERBACK

Chapel Hill, Sept. 15—The quarterbacking duties on the University of North Carolina football team, which encounters South Carolina here September 25, will fall on the shoulders of Crowell Little, senior letterman, and George Stirnweiss, sophomore speed merchant.

Little and stirnweiss are of similar build. Both stand five feet 9 and

weigh approximately 165 pounds. Stirnweiss is a bit the stockier of the two.

As to smartness and skill, Little undoubtedly has the edge, due primarily to two years of varsity experience. Little directed the Tar Heels during most of the 1936 campaign. He also was the understudy to Harry Montgomery two years ago.

ocratic Club of Washington will elect officers at its annual meeting tonight.

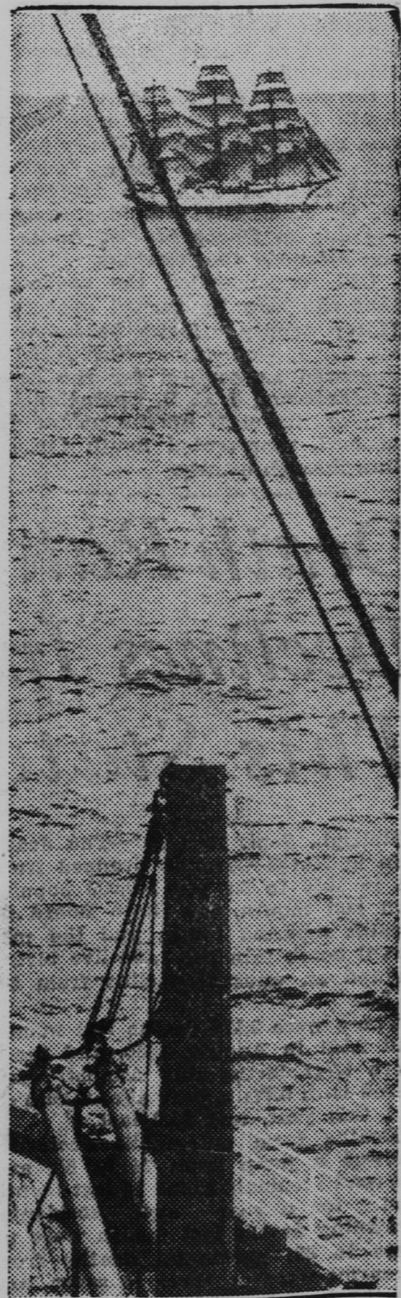
