CHICKERNEO PUNTS FOR PITT PANTHERS



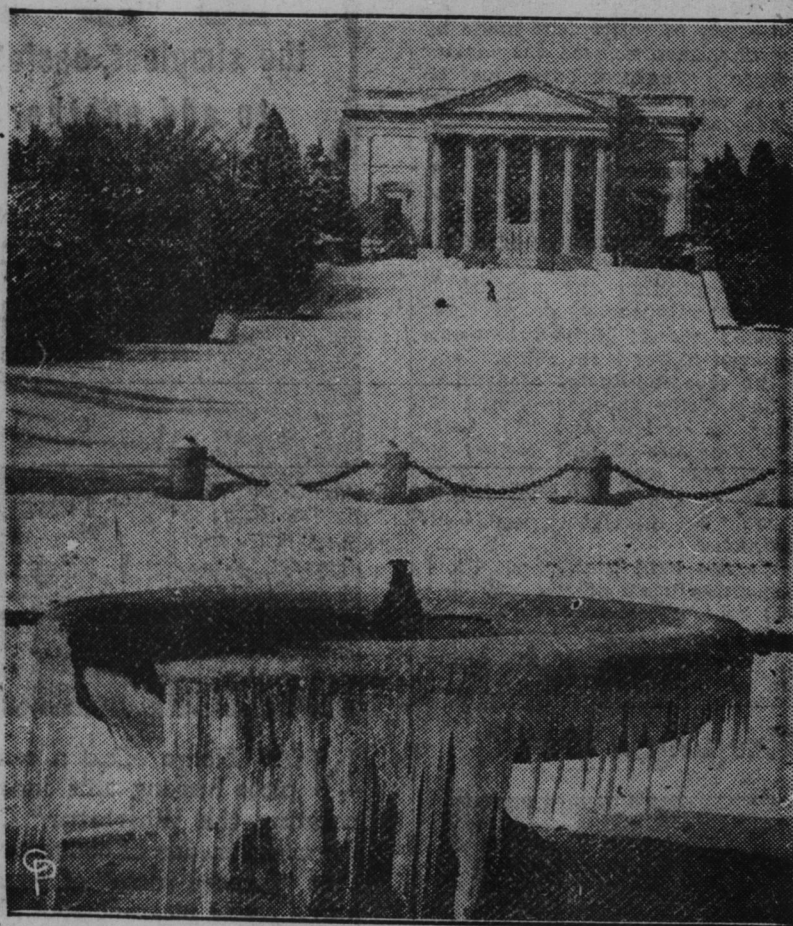

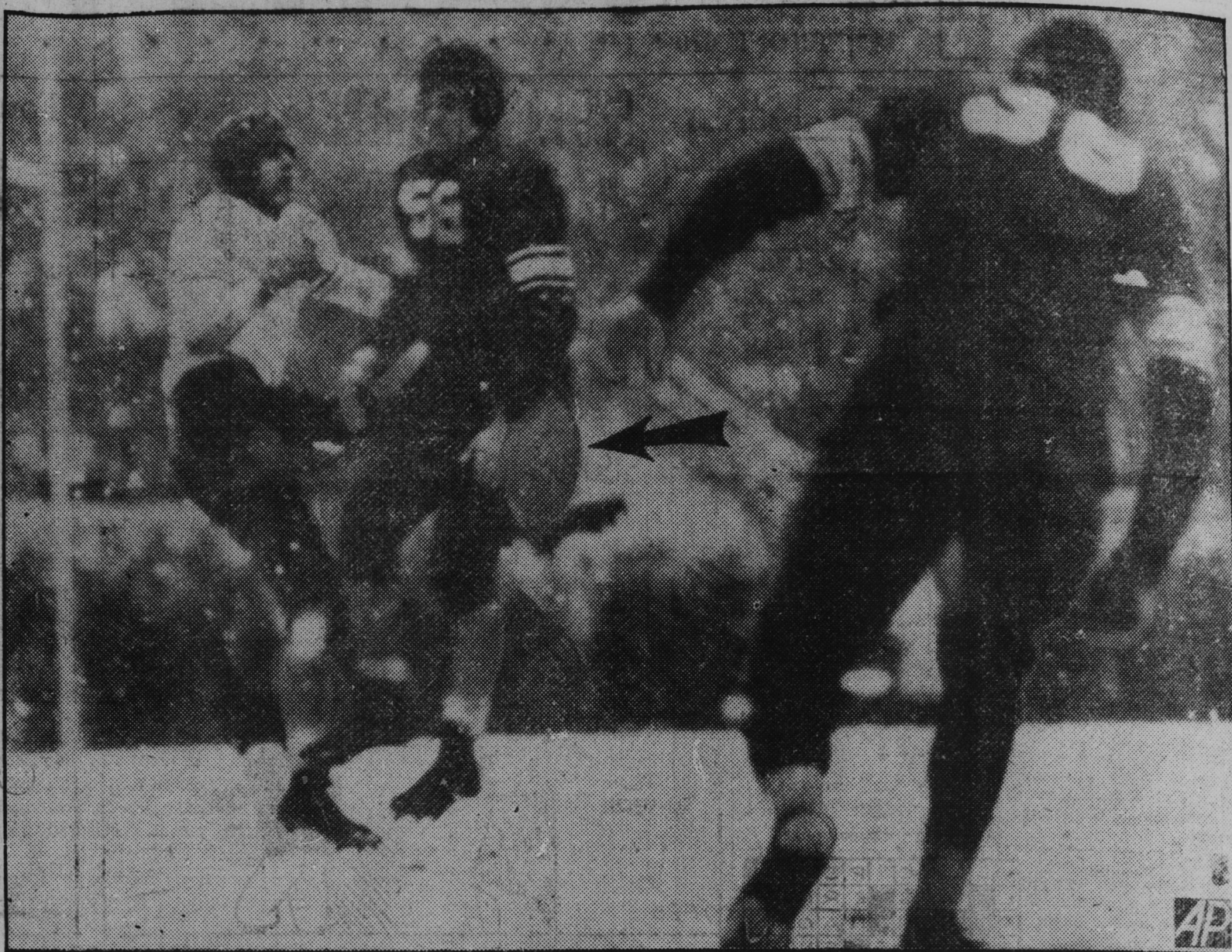

PERDUE BLOCKS PITT PUNT AND WINS FOR DUKE!



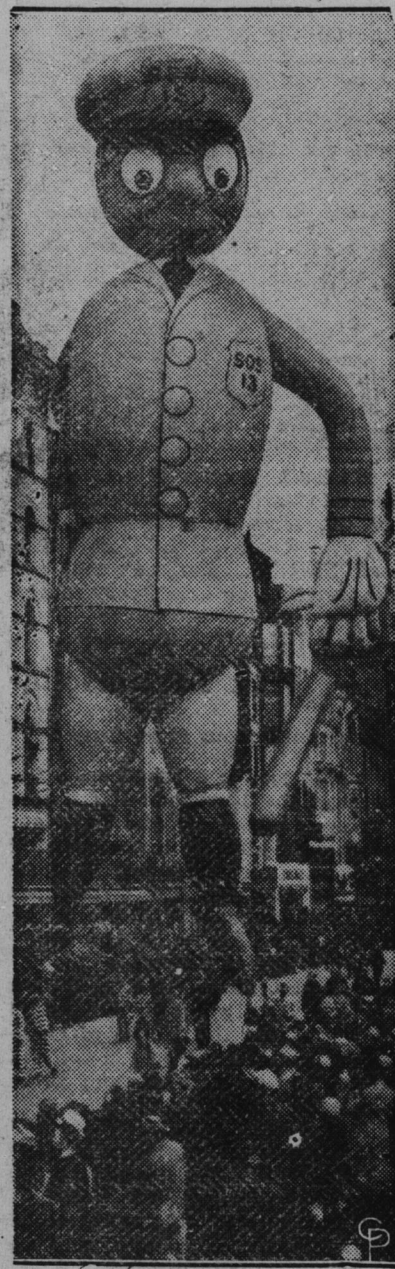
