

PLAYING PROBABILITIES

ALL OBSERVANT players have learned that the holder of a weak hand is likely to make a short-suit lead against a no trump contract, in the hope that he may hit upon the long suit of his partner, who probably has some side re-entries for it. Conversely, someone who has made a length-showing fourth-best lead is likely to have high cards for re-entries right in his own hand. Bearing that in mind can guide the declarer in his selection of the way to play any particular suit, counting the long-suit leader as more likely than his partner to hold any paror being successful with the spade finesse.

If South had played the Q on that second round club trick, he would have been set either two or three tricks, depending on what he did next time he was in the lead.
