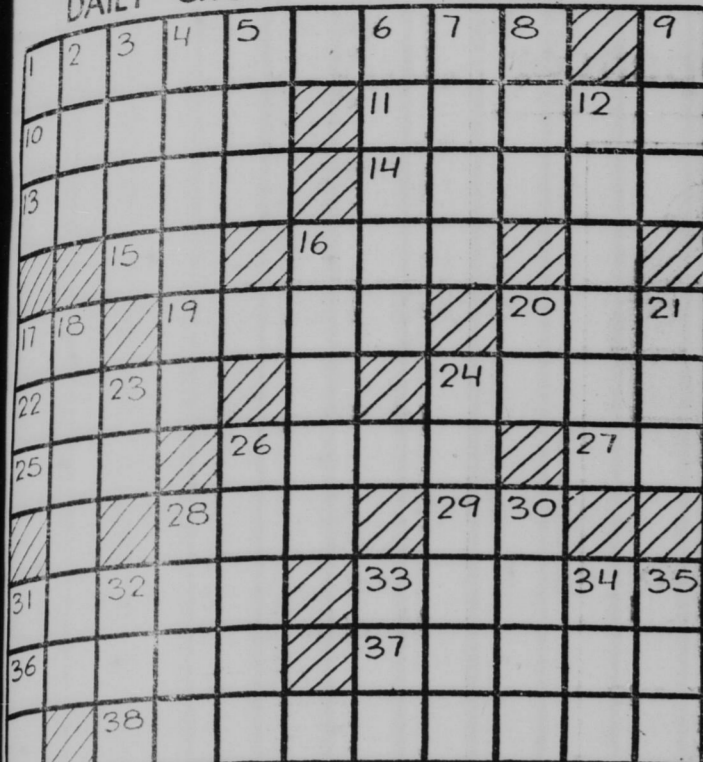

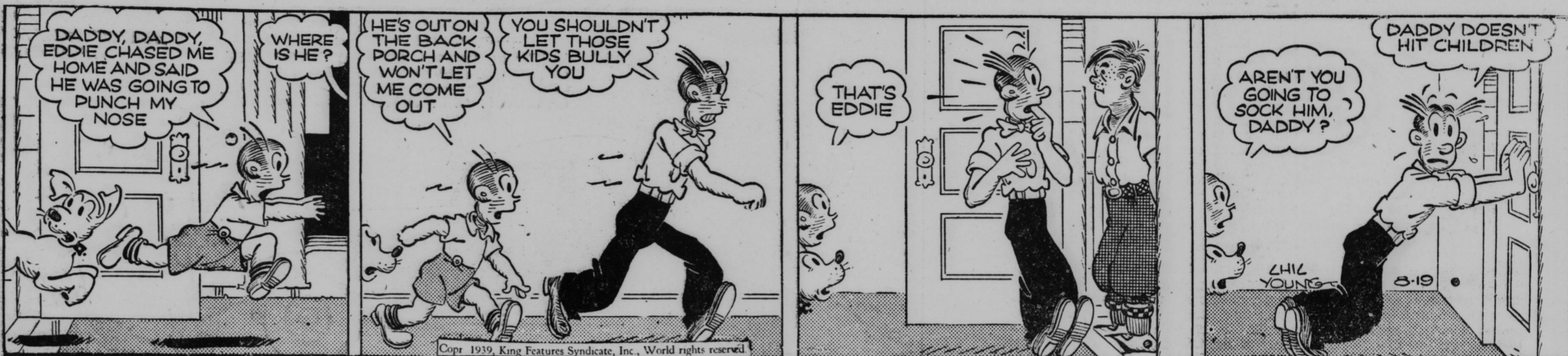

INTERFERENCE HURTS

WHEN BOTH sides have strong holdings, in different suits, each usually interferes with the bidding of the other to such an extent that neither pair gets into its best contract. Most strikingly is shown when one side has great length in two suits and the opponents have length in the other two. Otherwise good bids are likely to "miss the boat" by slanting in such situations.
