

Italy Versus Russia

Newspaper quotations respectively from Rome and Moscow and diplomatic reports from our Italian and Russian embassies indicate to Washington that Il Duce Mussolini is quite well satisfied with Herr Hitler's Scandinavian campaign, but that Comrade Stalin seems pretty glum.

That isn't surprising. Il Duce's realm is too far removed from the North Sea, the Baltic and the Scandinavian Atlantic to concern him. What frets him is the prospect at Gibralar, Suez and in Balkan waters. He doesn't care a hoot for the northern Atlantic outlet. Correspondingly, Comrade Stalin's headache isn't with Italy's Mediterranean. He has his responsibilities to the southeastward, but he can take care of them by land.


