

Mussolini Makes Announcement of Declarations of War to Blackshirt Legions Gathered Throughout Italy; Says "Italy Does Not Intend To Bring Other People Into the Conflict."

Rome, June 10 .- (AP)-Italy joined the war tonight at he side of the German nazi legions which are pressing down perilously on France and Paris itself.

(In Berlin it was announced that Italian troops already had entered France through the Riviera).

Notice of the plunge into hostilities after months of teetering on the brink was made in a widely-cheered, bombastic speech by Premier Mussolini from the balcony of the Palazzo Venezia.

His announced war aims called chiefly for recovered control of the Mediterranean. "Our will," he said, "is that Italy does not intend to bring
