

Bombers in All-Day Attacks Kill Two Persons and Injure 22, British Declare.

London, July 3.—(AP)—German bombers in all-day attacks today over the whole length of England aying the group would have opposed killed two persons and injured 22. The reiders dropped bombs on the southeast coast, in the northeast of England, in Scotland and on the eastern English shore.

Three German bombers were shot down, one of them in a fierce fight off the southeast coast.

Today's casualties brought to 15 dead and approximately 144 wound-ed the total for the last 24 hours.

New stabs at the German Ruhr, Westphalia, Belgium and Denmark were made meantime by the royal air force.

German raiders were continuous ly in the air over England today, both morning and afternoon.

A baby and a grandmother were reported killed by a bomb which demolished a house.
