

GOING BACK AND FORTH SELDOM can a declarer get efsective results if he has to keep playing from his own hand and never is able to get into the dummy to lead toward his own cards or use some set-up ones in the dummy That is why a weak long suit in a weak hand opposite a strong one makes a better declaration as a rule than a generally strong hand with nothing opposite it The long suit, if trump, fur-nishes plenty of entries to that holding, and the high cards do likewise for the hand laid on the






